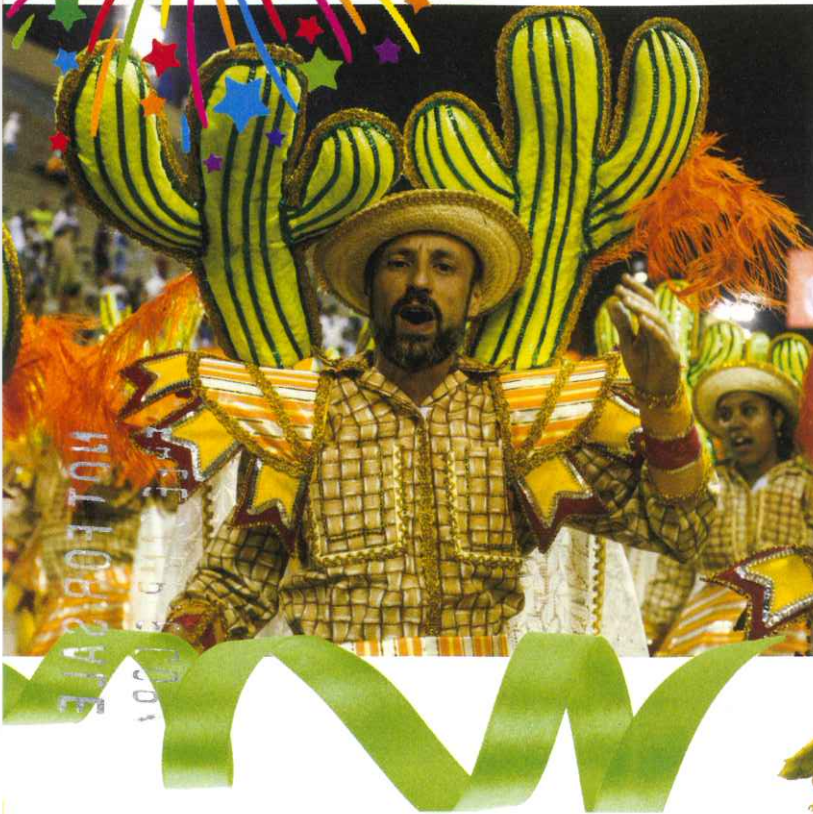

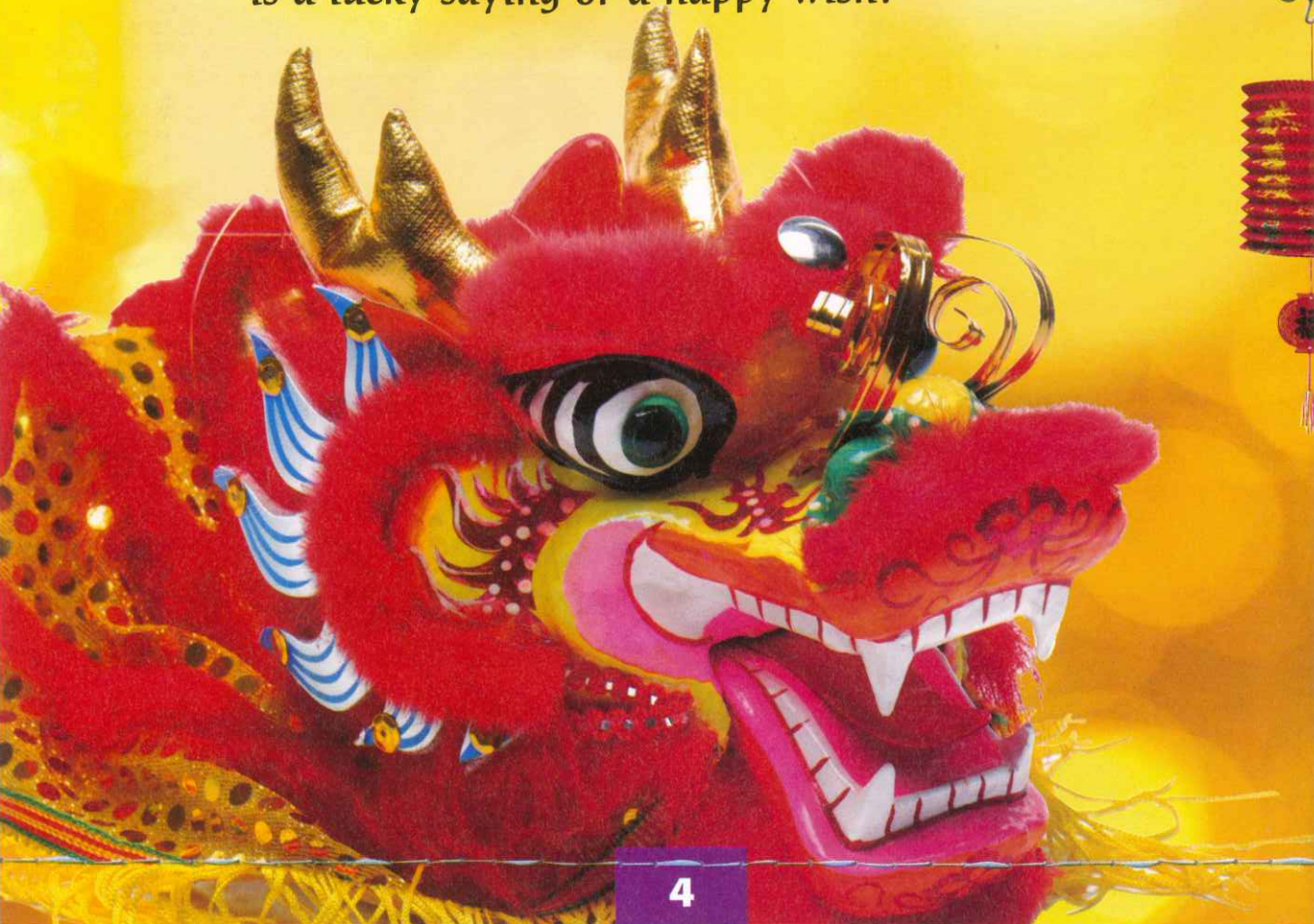

CHINESE NEW YEAR

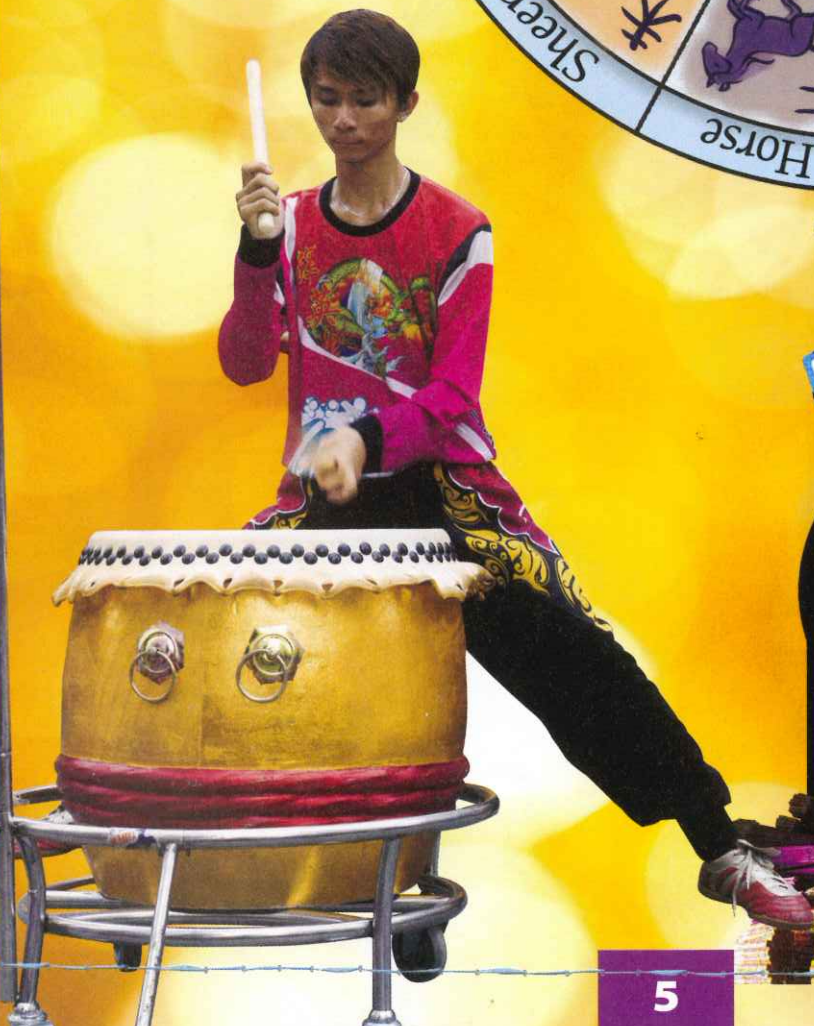
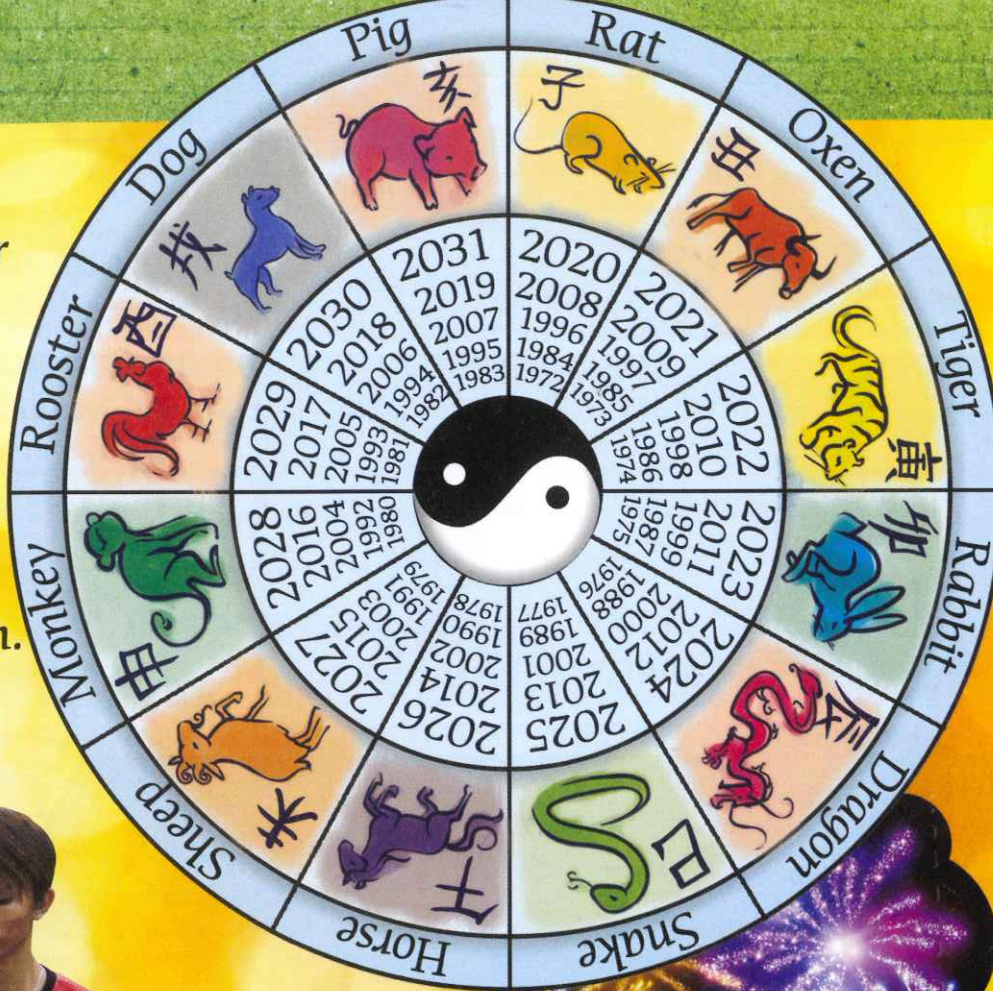
There are red decorations in every house. A red dragon is dancing in the street. Fireworks light up the sky. It's Chinese New Year!

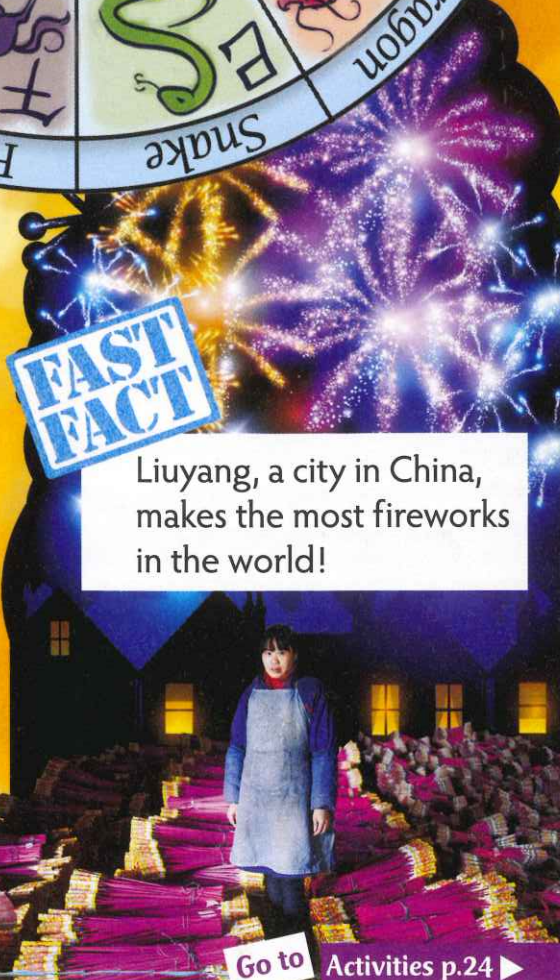


Each year of the Chinese calendar has an animal symbol. There are twelve animals. Look at the calendar. Find the year you were born in. Which animal are you?
